1. Introduction

- 1.1 Prospectus for admission to B. Pharm Course 2010 through lateral entry scheme has been approved by the Government of Kerala and is published herewith. The prospectus issued in previous year is not valid for 2010.
- 1.2 Lateral Entry Scheme is intended to admit meritorious Diploma holders to the Second year of the B. Pharm course to enable them to obtain a Degree in Pharmacy.
- 1.3 Lateral Entry Scheme as approved by the Government of Kerala will be for the 10% of seats over and above the sanctioned intake and the lapsed seats of 1st year B.Pharm course 2009 batch admissions.
- 1.4 Students who are directly admitted to B. Pharm second year through lateral entry shall pass those subjects of B. Pharm first year which are not covered under D. Pharm curriculum as prescribed by the respective Universities.
- 1.5 The admission will be subject to the regulations of the Universities concerned.

2. Institutions, Courses and Intake

The list of various Pharmacy Institutions included for lateral entry to the B.Pharm course 2010 admission is given in **Annexure-I(a)** and **Annexure I(b)**.

3. Fee Structure

Existing fee structure for the B.Pharm regular course as approved by the Government for Government and Self-financing colleges will be followed.

4. Eligibility for Admission

4.1 **Nativity:** Candidate should be an Indian citizen of Kerala origin. In order to prove that a candidate is an Indian citizen of Kerala origin, for the limited purpose of eligibility for admission, he/she has to produce any one of the following certificates in the body of the application form itself.

- (i) Certificate from Village Officer/Tahsildar to show that he/she or his/her mother/father was born in Kerala.

OR

- (ii) Certificate from Village Officer/Tahsildar to the effect that candidate has been resident of Kerala State for a period of 7 years within a continuous period of 15 years.

OR

- (iii) The true copy of relevant page of Secondary School Leaving Certificate showing the place of birth in Kerala of the candidate or either of the parents of the candidate(in which case corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate is necessary).

OR

- (iv) The true copy of the relevant page of the Passport issued by the Government of India, showing the candidate's or either of the parents (in which case corroborative certificate to establish the relationship

between the parent and the candidate is necessary) place of birth in Kerala.

OR

- v) A certificate of birth from the authority competent to register birth (Panchayat/ Municipality / Corporation) showing the candidate's or either of the parents (in which case corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate is necessary) place of birth in Kerala, to be issued by a competent officer of the registering authority.

4.2 **Academic:** Candidates shall have studied **Diploma in Pharmacy** (under ER 91) in an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India and shall have passed the diploma examination conducted by the **State Board of D. Pharm Examinations** or equivalent and must have a minimum of **50% marks for the II year D. Pharm examination**.

4.2.1 A relaxation of 5% marks in the qualifying examination will be allowed to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes / OEC candidates. For candidates belonging to SC/ST community a pass in the qualifying examination will be sufficient. Candidate shall have obtained registration with Pharmacy Council and the registration certificate is to be produced at the time of counseling.

4.3 **Age:** There is no upper age limit for admission to the course.

5. **Reservation of Seats**

5.1A (i) Seats available in Govt. Colleges will be filled by Director of Medical Education. In the case of self financing colleges, 50% of the government quota seats will be filled by the DME and 50% by the management, on the basis the rank obtained in the Entrance Examination.

(ii) Lapsed seats from the Government quota will be filled by the DME and management quota will be filled by the concerned management on the basis of the rank obtained in the Entrance Examination.

[B] **Mandatory Reservation:** Distribution of seats as per mandatory reservation principles in the case of seats allotted by Director of Medical Education will be as follows:

(i) State Merit	64%
(ii) Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC)	26%
Ezhava	9%
Muslim	8%
Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indian	2%
Other Backward Christian (OBX)	1%
Other Backward Hindu (OBH)	5%
Kudumbi	1%
(iii) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes	10%
Scheduled Case (SC)	8%
Scheduled Tribe (ST)	2%

5.2 **Claim for communal reservation**

(a) **State Merit.** The seats under the State Merit will be filled purely on merit (State wide) basis.

(b) Claim for communal reservation under socially and Educationally Backward Classes (**SEBC**).

Note: - Reservation to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. dated

2-5-1966 as amended from time to time. [See **Annexure II(d)** for the list of communities under SEBC].

(i) **Candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes** as per G.O (P) 208/66/Edn. Dated 2-5-1966 whose annual family income (ie. Annual income of all members in the family from all sources taken together) does not exceed **Rs.4,50,000/-** (Rupees Four Lakhs fifty thousand only) (including basic pay and DA of salaried persons) are eligible for reservation under this item.

(ii) Candidates claiming reservation under SEBC quota such as Ezhava, Muslim, Other Backward Hindus, **Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indian**, Other Backward Christian and Kudumbi should produce both Community and Income certificates obtained from the concerned Village Officer/Tahsildar. The above certificates should be obtained in the body of the application form itself.

(iii) Applicants claiming reservation under Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indian quota should produce a community certificate from the concerned Village Officer/Tahsildar specifying that they belong to **Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indian** community.

(iv) Children of inter-caste married couple claiming communal reservation under SEBC should furnish an 'inter-caste marriage certificate' from the Village Officer/Tahsildar in the format given in **Annexure III**, in addition to community certificate. Such candidates can avail themselves of communal reservation under any one of the communities of their parents, to be mentioned by the candidate in the relevant column of the application. They need not produce the income certificate.

(v) Candidates who are children of Inter-caste married couple of which one is SC/ST who will be eligible for educational and monetary benefits admissible to SC/ST as per Section 2 (ii) of GO (MS) No.25/2005/SCSTDD dated 20-06-2005, if eligible for reservation under SEBC, will be granted the same based on the community shown in the inter-caste marriage certificate issued by Revenue officials and to be attached by them with the application.

(c) Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota

(i) Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe candidates should apply in the application form meant for them. (*See Annexure II(a) & (b) for the list of SC/ST communities*) and they should obtain the caste/community certificate from the Tahsildar in the body of the application form itself. SC/ST caste status of children of parents contracted Inter caste marriage will be subject to the orders/clarification issued in G.O.(MS) No.11/05/SCSTDD dated 22-03-2005, GO (MS) No.25/2005/ SCSTDD dated 20-06-2005 and the judgment dated 10-08-2005 of the Full Bench of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in WP 2483/2005 and connected cases.

(ii) The Christian converts who have subsequently embraced Hinduism should produce caste/community certificate in the application form. The following certificate should also be got recorded by the revenue official below the certificate "The certificate is issued after observing the guidelines issued in Government Circular No.18421/E2/SC/ST/DD dated 15.12.1987."

(iii) The applications for the reserved seats of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates which do not contain SC/ST Certificate (Community Certificate) from the Tahsildar in the prescribed form in the body of the application will not be considered on any account for claiming community reservation against the seat reserved for SC/ST candidates (Vide G.O.(MS) 31/90/SC/ST/D.L dated 25.05.1990).The community certificate should clearly specify that the candidate himself/herself (not the father or mother) belongs to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes. The community

certificate obtained earlier for other purpose will not be accepted. The candidates who are reconverted to Hinduism from Christianity of Scheduled castes origin should produce community certificate form the Tahsildar concerned along with a copy of Gazette Notification regarding re-conversion.

(iv) The claims for reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quotas will also be subject to verification and clearance by the Screening Committee constituted for the purpose by Government vide G.O(P)No.19/2002/SCSTDD dated 20.4.2002 and as authorized by section 6 of the Kerala (Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Regulation of Issue of Community Certificates Act, 1996 (Act 11 of 1996)

(v) The SC/ST claims in respect of those who have migrated from one State to another will be subject to the provisions of G.O (MS) No.10/86/SC/ST/DD dated 12.2.1986. Only the children of those who had migrated to this State before the promulgation of the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order 1950 and the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order 1950 and ordinarily reside in this State can claim SC/ST benefits from the State of Kerala. They must be able to prove this, if required.

6. Other general rules for mandatory reservation

- (i) The seats unavailed of by the Scheduled Castes candidates will go to the Scheduled Tribes candidates and vice versa.
- (ii) The seats unavailed of by the SC/ST candidates will be filled by Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates [See **Annexure II(c)** for the list of OEC's]. The seats that still remain unavailed of will go to the Open Merit pool (Statewide basis). OEC's will be eligible for reservation only if their annual family income from all sources including pay and DA of salaried persons is up to Rs.4.5 lakhs and the candidate has secured 45% marks in the 2nd year D. Pharm examination. Such candidates should furnish income certificate in the body of application form itself.
- (iii) The seats unavailed of by the SEBC category candidates will be allotted under State Merit in the final re-allotment in the stream.

7. Application Forms

Application form and prospectus can be downloaded from the official web site of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations 'cee-kerala.org'. There will be separate application form for General and SC/ST candidates. The application fee will be **Rs.300/-** for General candidates and **Rs.150/-** for SC/ST candidates (including those eligible for SC/ST benefits). The application fee will not be refunded under any circumstances.

8. Submission of Applications

The completed application forms with all documents, along with a DD from any nationalized bank for **Rs.300/-** for general candidates and **Rs.150/-** for SC/ST candidates (including those eligible for SC/ST benefits) in favour of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations payable at Thiruvananthapuram should reach **Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Housing Board Buildings, SanthiNagar, Thruvananthapuram-01** before the time specified by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The cover forwarding the application should be super scribed as "Application for admission to B Pharm (Lateral Entry) -2010".

Warning: - *Incomplete applications with defective or incomplete certificates will be rejected. Belated applications also will not be accepted. Documents or certificates furnished after the last date fixed for receipt of applications will not be considered on any account. No candidate will be permitted to*

incorporate any additional details in the application form or to submit any additional documents after the submission of the Application.

9. Certificates/ documents to be submitted along with the application.

- (i) True copy of the S.S.L.C book or any relevant school records to prove date of birth.
- (ii) True copy of the mark list of the qualifying examination.
- (iii) Any one of the certificates to prove nativity, in the Application Form.
- (iv) Certificates in support of claim for Communal Reservation, if any, in the Application Form.
- (v) Inter-Caste marriage certificate, if applicable.
- (vii) Any other documents mentioned in the Notification of the entrance examination.

10. Entrance Examination

10.1 The entrance examination will be conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE) at a single venue.

10.1.1 The Entrance Examination will be of two hours duration.

10.1.2 The standard of the Entrance Examinations will be that D Pharm Course with subjects (*Pharmaceutics, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Pharmacology and Pharmacognosy*)]

10.1.3 **The Scheme of Entrance examination:** The examination will be objective type with **100 Multiple Choice Questions** and based on single response. For each question, four suggested answers would be given, of which only one will be the **MOST APPROPRIATE RESPONSE**. The candidate will have to select and mark the alphabet (A,B,C, or D) corresponding to the most appropriate response in the OMR Answer Sheet given to them. The bubbles in the OMR Answer sheet should be filled up by using ball point (blue or black) pen only.

10.2 The question paper for objective type examinations will be given in the form of ' **Question-Booklets**'. The candidates **will not be allowed** to take home the Question booklets issued to them in the Examination Hall. **The question booklet should be returned along with the OMR Answer sheet to the invigilator.**

10.3 **Scoring Scheme:** For each correct response the candidate will be awarded **four marks** and for each incorrect response **one mark** will be deducted from the total score. However, in the event of failure to answer questions, (i.e. no response is indicated for an item in the OMR answer sheet) no deduction from the total score will be made. More than one answer indicated against a question will be deemed as incorrect response and will be awarded negative marks. Therefore the candidates are advised not to attempt an answer, should they not be sure of the response, because mere guessing may lead to choice of wrong answers, with the consequent penalty of negative marking.

10.4 Appearance of a candidate in the entrance examination, or inclusion of a candidate in the rank list does not entitle him/her for admission to a course, unless the rules regarding eligibility for admission, as laid down in the prospectus under various Clauses, are satisfied.

10.5 Any malpractice, or any attempt to commit any kind of malpractice, in the examination, will result in the summary disqualification of the candidature.

10.6 Admit Cards:

- (a) The admit card for the Entrance Examinations, will be sent to the eligible candidates after assigning the roll numbers. List of such eligible candidates will be published in the CEE's Website (www.cee-kerala.org)
- (b) The venue of the examination and timetable will be noted in the admit card. The reservation allowed / disallowed will be noted therein.
- (c) **Non-receipt of Admit Cards:** Admit cards to the eligible candidates will be sent in the address mentioned in the Application Form/Computer Data Sheet.
- (d) **Rejection memo will be sent to the candidate whose application has been rejected.**
- (e) Candidates who do not get the Admit card but whose application has been accepted will be issued an '**Identification Certificate**' through the **Liaison Officer** present at the notified venue, between 9 a.m. & 1 p.m. on the previous day of the Examination.
- (f) **The candidate himself/herself should meet the Liaison Officer with:**
 - (i) *his/her photograph affixed on a plain paper and attested by the Head of the Institution where the candidate has studied/by a Gazetted officer.*
 - (ii) *An identical photograph to be affixed in the Identification Certificate.*
- (g) In the event of non-receipt of admit cards, duplicate admit cards or Identification Certificates will not be issued to the candidates from the Office of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, directly.
- (h) A candidate who does not possess either the admit card or identification certificate issued by the Liaison officer, will not be admitted to the examination hall, under any circumstances.

10.7 Preparation of Rank List: The rank list will be prepared on the basis of the total marks secured by the candidates in the Entrance Examination.

10.7.1 Resolving tie: In case of tie in the marks in Entrance Examination, candidate scoring higher marks in the 2nd year of D. Pharm course will be placed higher in the rank list. If the tie persists, the candidates will be ranked based on age, the older being placed higher in the rank list.

10.8 Qualifying Standards in the Entrance Examination: Candidates (except those belonging to SC/ST categories) **shall secure a minimum of 10% marks for the Entrance Examination** to qualify to figure in the rank list.

- 11. Publication of Results:** The rank list will be published by Commissioner for Entrance Examinations which will be available in the Website of the CEE and in all Government Medical Colleges for reference. There is no provision for revaluation or rechecking of the answer scripts or recounting of the marks.
- 12. Validity of Rank List:** The rank list published by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will be valid for 3 months from the date of publication of the rank list.
- 13. Liquidated damages:** All the candidates selected for the course will have to execute a bond in stamped paper, at the time of joining the course, to the effect that he / she shall not discontinue the course he/she has been allotted to after the validity period of the ranklist, failing which he/she will have to pay the liquidated damages. The amount of liquidated damages and the conditions regarding levying liquidated damages from candidates discontinuing the course will be the same as that of the regular batch.

14. **Publication of category list** -Separate category wise list will be published for SEBC/SC/ST reservation. Candidates are advised to verify the category list published by the CEE and satisfy themselves regarding their position in the list. If candidates have any complaint in this regard he/she may approach the Office of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations **within seven days** after publication of the category list, for necessary action. Complaint received thereafter will not be entertained.

15. **Counseling and allotment**

15.1 The allotment of candidates will be made by the Director of Medical Education (DME) through personal appearance of candidates and in accordance with candidate's rank in the entrance examination and availability of seats at the time of counseling. Information regarding the time, date and place of the personal appearance will be notified later through leading dailies. No individual intimation will be sent to the candidates in this regard.

15.2 **Documents / certificates to be produced at the time of counseling**

- (i) Admit card of the Entrance Examination
- (ii) S.S.L.C Book / any other school record to prove date of birth.
- (iii) Original mark list of qualifying examination.(D.Pharm)
- (iv) Original certificate of registration with **Pharmacy Council**.
- (v) Any other items specified in the notification for counseling.

15.3 The selection for admission will be provisional and subject to the verification of the original documents by the concerned Principals.

15.4 This Prospectus is subject to modification/ addition/deletion, as may be deemed necessary by the Government.
