2. Agreement dated 17.06.08 entered into with Self Financing Medical College Management Association by the Secretary (Health).

ORDER

- 1. Governments have discussed the matter of allotment of seats and fees to be levied with the management of the Self Financing Medical Colleges and an agreement has been executed with them for the admissions 2008-09.
- 2. Sanction is accorded to the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations for including the following Medical Colleges, who have entered in to agreement with Government in respect of admission and collection of fees from students to be admitted for MBBS Course 2008-09, in the list of Institutions for allotment of students subject to the terms and conditions specified below: -

3. Terms and Conditions: -

- 1) 50% of the seats in the Colleges will be filled up from the list of students qualified in the Common Entrance Test conducted by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations with merit and applying the principles of reservation in Government Colleges.
- 2) 20% of the above seats in the Institutions having minority status will be filled up by the CEE from the list prepared by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations from the students belonging to the community, which established the member college based on their interse merit.
- 3) In Dr. Somerwell Memorial CSI Medical College which is an institution having minority status, the Government shall allot 20% out of 50% seats agreed to be filled by the Government ie., 10 students, from among the students belonging to the South India United Church (SIUC) community of the South Kerala Diocese concerned on the basis of their interse merit from the rank list published by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. While allotting such students to the Dr. Somerwell Memorial CSI Medical College, Karakonam, it shall be ensured that 8 shall be from students belonging to SIUC South Kerala Diocese (SKD) (other than Scheduled Caste converted Christians of the South Kerala Diocese) having SIUC, SKD certificates and 2 students shall be Scheduled Caste converted Christians belonging to SIUC, SKD having SIUC, SKD certificates. A certificate from the Revenue authorities should also have to be produced before the CEE for admission to the above seats with in the specified time period. * SIUC SKD status shall be provided / established by

the certificate issued by the Bishop, SKD. In the absence of eligible SIUC-SKD and SC converted to SIUC - SKD candidates, such seats shall be filled by the Management from the said minority backward community in the manner forward by the Management in filling up Management seats (35% seats). 20% out of the 50% seats agreed to be filled up by the Government, ie., 10 students in MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna and Kannur Medical College, Kannur from students belonging to Muslim community on the basis of their inter-se merit in the rank list prepared by the CEE. Allotment shall be made by the CEE and it will be published in the official website of the CEE.

- 4) The Government shall furnish the list of the students to be admitted in the college by the management concerned and the management concerned shall admit the students specified in the list. The students in the list will be given specific instruction as to the date and time of presentation before the college for admission, the amount of fees to be paid, the amount of refundable deposit to be remitted, and the records to be submitted at the time of admission. The management concerned shall admit the students who have complied with the instructions as certified by the Government. The Government shall furnish such lists eligibility conditions as prescribed in the Prospectus 2008. Final allotment shall be made on or before the 20th day of September 2008.
- 5) If any student is not admitted by the management concerned for specific defects or for any reason whatsoever, it shall intimate the Government the defects or reasons as the case may be and the Government shall rectify the

defects or state the reasons for accepting the list or furnish a revised list which the management concerned shall accept and admit the students accordingly, following the above procedures but in any case not later than 5 pm on 25th September 2008.

The management concerned shall be entitled to fill those seats still remaining unfilled after 25th September. The Government shall not have any claim over such seats after 25th September and the forfeited vacancy shall not be brought forward to succeeding year for compensation.

- 6) The fees for the above 50% will be Rs. 45,000 per annum. Annual tuition fees for SC/ST/OE candidates and those candidates eligible for educational and monetary benefits as per G.O.(MS)25/2005/SCSTDD,dated: will be paid by Government at the rate of fixed by the Fee Regulatory Committee, appointed by the Government.
- 7) 35% of the total seats in the Colleges will be filled up by the Management concerned on the basis of merit of the candidates who have submitted applications to the college, by calculating the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology in the qualifying examination and the marks obtained in the test conducted by the Association; the marks for Physics, Chemistry and Biology in the qualifying examination and the marks at the test conducted by the Association apportioned in the ration 50:50 and complying with the conditions stipulated in the prospectus of the Association. The management concerned is at liberty to fix a minimum percentage of marks higher than the percentage of marks for the qualifying examination or for

Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the qualifying examination as fixed by the Medical Council of India, for admission to the course in the college of the management concerned. The Association may conduct common entrance examination as part of selection process with the approval by the Admission Supervisory Committee constituted by the Government.

- 8) Each student thus admitted by the management concerned to the above mentioned 35% seats shall pay annual tuition fees upto Rs.5,50,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only) and shall also be liable to remit upto Rs.5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs only) as refundable deposit which shall be refunded without interest at the end of course of study by the management concerned for which signed receipts with seal shall be given.
- 9) The remaining 15% seats will be filled up by the Management by eligible students, who are children / dependents of Non-Resident Indians. The fees collected from these students will be Rs.9,00,000/- (Rupees Nine Lakhs only).
- 10) The managements have agreed not to receive cash or kind other than specified as fee above.
- 11)The said agreement will be submitted by the Government before the Admission Supervisory Committee, Fee Regulatory Committee and also before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India for approval.
- 12) The member colleges will be entitled to collect uniform fees not exceeding Rs.2,60,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Sixty Thousand only), which is the fees fixed by the Fee Regulatory Committee in the State from all students

excluding those admitted under NRI quota, if the agreement is not approved by the Court or any other competent authority to declare so.

13) In the case of any further litigation, the above terms and conditions will be subject to the court of Law.
