3. Consensual Agreement dated 04.08.2017 entered into between MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna and Government.

## **ORDER**

In pursuance of the agreement arrived at in the meeting held on 10/07/2017, Government, as per the Order read above, have approved the fee structure for admission to MBBS course in MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna, for the academic year 2017-18. Accordingly, Government and Management of MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna, entered into consensual agreement with specific terms and conditions regarding admission to MBBS Course for the academic year 2017-18

- 2. In the circumstances, Government are pleased to accord sanction for the admission of students in MBBS course in MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna through the centralised allotment to be conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations subject to following terms and conditions:
  - (i) Total seats ie, 100 seats in the Educational Agency will be filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE) from the list of candidates who have qualified in the NEET [UG] 2017, through common counselling. Of this 50% ie 50 seats will be filled up in accordance with merit and reservation principles followed by Government from time to time, subject to clause (ii) below.

(ii) For Minority Institutions, 15 seats out of 50 seats will be filled up by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations from the list of students belonging to the minority community which established the college and based on their inter se merit.

(iii) The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the list of the students to be admitted in the Educational Institution, and the Educational Agency shall admit the students specified in the list in the order of merit. The students in

the list will be given specific instructions as to the date and time of presentation before the college for admission and the amount of fees to be paid and records to be submitted at the time of admission. The Educational Agency need admit only those students who have complied with the instructions given by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations.

- The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, through notification shall (iv) specify that at the time of common counselling, the students belonging to minority community will be required to furnish community certificate from Revenue Authority and submit in writing about their willingness to take admission and pay the requisite fee in the Educational Agency. There shall be only two rounds of Common Counselling by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The candidates and their parents are required to submit before Commissioner for Entrance Examinations regarding their willingness to pay the fee provided in the notification, along with other documents and take admission in the college. After two rounds of counselling, and spot admission, Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall determine the number of seats that are still vacant and forward to the college a list of students in the order of merit equaling to ten times the number of vacant seats, so that in case of any stray vacancy arising in the college such seat can be filled up from the above Such candidates should confirm their minority status (if belongs to minority community) as well as the fact that they fulfill other conditions which should be prescribed by the college. Accordingly, the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall prepare separate list of minority students seeking admission to the college in the order of merit. The representatives of the college present during counselling shall check the minority status of the candidate. The Candidates who belongs to the Minority Community should produce community certificate certificate from the Revenue Authorities
- (v) The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the allotment list of the students to be admitted to the Educational Agency as per the schedule fixed by him. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will not re-allot students already allotted to the College and admitted after the spot allotment/ final allotment. The students must join the college on or before the last date of joining the course as per the schedule of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations.
- (vi) The Educational Agency shall be entitled to fill up those seats still remaining unfilled after the closure of allotment by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. These unfilled seats even after the spot allotment by Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, will be filled up by the college from the list of the students forwarded by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations as per the direction of Honourable Supreme Court and the fee payable shall be that collected from the management candidates.
- (vii) If any student is not admitted by the Educational Agency for specific defects or for reasons to be recorded in writing, it shall intimate the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations the defects or reasons as the case may be and the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall rectify the defects or state the reasons for accepting the list or furnish a revised list which the Educational Agency shall accept and admit the students accordingly following the above procedures. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations/Government shall not have any claim over such seats and the forfeited seats shall not be brought forward to succeeding year for compensation.

- (viii) The Government and the Educational Agency after series of discussions with the representatives of the minority community agree to collect annual fees at the following concessional rates from the most meritorious students and students belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes admitted under the 50% Government merit Quota, during the entire course period from 2017-18.
  - (a) (i) Students belonging to BPL /SEBC family as per State Government norms, not exceeding 40% seats of Government Meric Quota, [i.e, 14% from BPL families and 26% from SEBC students] have to pay Rs Rs.25,000/-per annum
  - (ii) If there are not sufficient candidates in the BPL category above, candidates with lowest income based on Income Certificate issued by the competent Revenue Authority will be considered.
  - (b) Other Candidates including those who have got admission under SC/ST reservation categories not exceeding 60% seats of Govt. Merit Quota, i.e, 8% from SC and 2% from ST and 50% seats from General Merit have to pay Rs 2,50,000 per annum. Fee for SC/ST/OEC Candidates admitted under Government Quota will be paid by the Government of Kerala.
- (ix) Duly Signed and sealed receipt shall be given by the Educational Agency for all the fees collected. Annual fees for the category mentioned in clause (viii)(b) will be directly paid by the students to the Educational Agency. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will deduct only Rs.10,000 from the students mentioned in clause (viii) (a) and (b) and this amount will be transferred to the Educational Agency within 45 days of admission failing which the Educational Agency can claim interest on the payment.
- (x) The remaining 50% of the seats (i.e 50 Seats) shall be filled up by the following methods.
  - (a) The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall allot to the Educational Agency who is entitled to fill up 15% seats(i.e. 15 seats) of the total seats in the Non-Resident Indian category (NRI) by admitting NEET Qualified Candidates who are children/dependents of Non Resident Indians, as per the conditions stipulated in GO(MS)No.34/2013/H&FWD dated 05.02.2013 and GO(MS)No.243/2014/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014.
  - (b) Each Student thus admitted to the above mentioned 15% seats as mentioned in clause (x)(a) shall pay annual tuition fee of Rs.15,00,000/-(Rupees Fifteen Lakhs only), for which signed and sealed receipts shall be given by the Educational Agency. In addition, the Educational Agency is permitted to collect an amount not exceeding one year fee of Rs.15,00,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Lakhs only) from the candidates in this category as interest free deposit to be returned on completion of the course. The Educational Agency can also collect from students their proportionate share of fees payable to the Universities, Government fees,

Medical Council of India fees, transportation charges, examination conducting charges, extra-curricular and other establishment charges etc. Such fees and amounts shall be specifically listed out and published each year by the Educational Agency without changes from the first year of fees paid. The candidate shall deposit with the admission counseling committee the demand draft towards the fees to be paid/payable to the Principal of the college. The Admission / Counselling Committee shall forthwith forward the Demand Draft to the Principal of the college.

- (c) The Educational Agency shall fill up the remaining 35% (ie 35 seats) of the total seats as allotted the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations by Common Counselling from the applications received by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations for the categorization mentioned by the minority community running the institutions, subject to the production of community certicates from the Revenue Authority based on inter-se merit of the candidates in the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test UG 2017 (NEET UG-2017). The Candidates shall submit a consent in stamped paper worth Rs. 200/- (Two Hundred Rupees) countersigned by the parents that they knowingly and willfully decided to opt for the higher fees approved by the FRC/Government which shall be notified in the website and prospectus of the Educational Agency and agreement and in the Government Order.
- (d) Each Student thus admitted by the Educational Agency to the above mentioned 35% seats as mentioned in clause (x)(c) shall pay annual tuition fee of Rs.11,00,000/- (Rupees Eleven Lakhs only), for which signed and sealed receipts shall be issued by the Educational Agency. In addition, the Educational Agency can collect an amount not exceeding one year fee of Rs.11,00,000/- (Rupees Eleven Lakhs only) from the students in this category as interest free deposit which shall be refunded at the end of the course. The Educational Agency can also collect from students their proportionate share of fees payable to the Universities, Government fees, Medical Council of India fees, transportation charges, examination conducting charges, extra-curricular and other establishment charges etc. Such fees and amounts shall be specifically listed out and published each year by the Educational Agency. In the event of them obtaining admission for Post Graduate studies the same obligation shall be executed after the completion of their PG study where the management shall in no way have a differential remuneration based on qualification for the period of service obligation.

All Students thus selected under Management Quota/NRI Quota shall remit the said amount as mentioned above for the first year of the course and produce a bank guarantee from Nationalized Bank or Scheduled Bank for an amount covering the fee for the remaining four years, i.e. for the entire course of study. The Educational Agency is entitled to refuse admission to those candidates who fail to submit/furnish Bank Guarantee before the last date of admission, under intimation to Commissioner for Entrance Examinations for allotment of a replacement candidate.

(xi) The Educational Agency shall be entitled to collect Caution Deposit of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) and other expenses and such other permitted amounts shall be collected from students joining in the Educational Agency. The Educational Agency can also collect from students their proportionate share of fees payable to the University, Government, Medical Council of India fees, transportation charges, examination conducting charges, extra-curricular and other establishment charges etc. The Educational Agency will ensure that no consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any students admitted to the Educational Agency.

(xii) The Educational Agency can retain the tuition fee remitted by the student in the event the student admitted under the Management Quota or Government Quota, discontinues his/her studies for any reason at any time after closure of admission. Further, in case, any student admitted to the Educational Agency decides to cancel the admission for any reason whatsoever, the Educational Agency shall be entitled to collect the tuition fee for the entire course. However, in the event of the seat so falling vacant being filled up by a new candidate, the tuition fee collected as per this

clause shall be refunded.

(xiii) The Educational Agency shall see no consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any student admitted to the Educational Agency. It shall be the liability of the Educational Agency to redress complaints from the students, on any matter other than those covered by the terms and conditions of this agreement in consultation with the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. Where the Educational Agency fails to redress any complaints referred to as above or on any matter covered under this agreement, it shall be the duty of the First party to take such steps as required under law to redress the complaints.

The Government shall arrange to provide Primary Health Centre/Community Health Centre/Autopsy perceiving facilities and ensure supply of cadavers required for the College as per the norms fixed by the Government. If any charges are applied by the Government for these facilities, the Educational Agency is entitled

to collect the same from the students.

(xv) The Educational Agency will be free to execute appropriate Service obligation bond from the students admitted under Government merit quota for a period not exceeding one year. In the event of the candidate obtaining admission to Post Graduate Course or higher speciality course the service obligation shall be executed after completion of P.G./ Higher speciality course of study where the management shall in no way have a differential remuneration for the service of obligation. If the candidates who have availed the Government Merit Quota seat desires to break the service obligation, they should pay liquidated damages to the minimum of Rs.5,00,000 (Rupees Five lakhs only) to the Educational Agency.

(xvi) The Consensual Agreement entered into with the Educational Agency is valid for all admitted candidates of the Academic Year 2017-18 only and shall not prejudicially affect the rights of the parties by virtue of the clauses herein, in

respect of the cases pending before any court of law.

(xvii) It shall be the duty of the first party to submit this consensual agreement before the Admission Supervisory Committee and Fee regulatory Committee constituted by the State of Kerala for post facto approval.

(xviii) Nothing in this agreement shall be deemed as a surrender of the unconditional right of the Minority Educational Agency regarding the admission of students in all the seats in the college.

(xix) Notwithstanding the conditions stated above any change/modification or new conditions added or existing conditions deleted on the Mutual agreement with the Government subsequently, shall form the part of this agreement. Such Government Order/s shall have the same effect of the agreement reached between the Educational Agency and the Government.

(xx) In the event of this agreement being set aside by any authority competent to do so, the fees and conditions fixed by the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee shall prevail.

(xxi) The Management shall be entitled to collect tuition fees approved/ endorsed for MBBS by the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee in the State, from all students, in the event of this consensual agreement not got approved as stipulated in clause (xi) above or consensual agreement is declared to be void or not enforceable by the Court or any authority competent to declare so.

(xxii) Candidates who receive allotment under Government quota/Management/NRI quota shall remit the requisite fee by way of Demand Draft drawn in favour of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, payable at Thiruvananthapuram or as

Notified by the CEE.
