1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Prospectus for admission to Post graduation in Super Specialty Courses in the academic year **2016-2017** which has been approved by the Government of Kerala, is published herewith. This contains general information and rules relating to admission to postgraduate super specialty courses for the academic year 2016-2017 and other related information. Candidates are requested to go through the prospectus carefully and acquaint themselves with the informations given. Candidates are also requested to visit the official websites of Commissioner of Entrance Examination (CEE) Kerala www.cee.kerala.gov.in and Director of Medical Education (DME) Kerala www.dme.kerala.gov.in regularly for notifications, updates and announcements.
- 1.2 The prospectus issued in earlier years for the course is not valid for year 2016. This prospectus sets out the rules and regulations for selection and admission to Post Graduation in Super specialty courses conducted in five Govt. Medical Colleges and Government merit seat, in self financing colleges within the state of Kerala. The candidates are requested to get themselves informed about the recognition status of the courses through the MCI website before they come for allotment. The allotment will be made according to merit, first for the recognized and then the permitted seats in a college for both the General merit and Service Quota candidates.

3. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

3.1 Nativity: Applicants should have satisfied the following conditions in Clause 3.1.1 & 3.1.2.

3.1.1 Indian citizen

3.1.2 Have passed the MBBS degree/PG degree (MD/MS/Dip NB recognised) from any of the Medical Colleges within India.

3.1.3 SC/ST candidate of Kerala origin are only eligible for mark relaxation in the Entrance Examination.

3.2 Basic Academic qualifications

3.2.1 MBBS degree

3.2.2 Appropriate postgraduate degree(MD/MS) of the universities in Kerala or any other university recognized by Kerala University of Health Sciences (KUHS) as equivalent thereto or appropriate Diplomate of National Board (Dip.N.B) Appropriate Post Graduate qualification required for applying to each of the Super Speciality Courses will be MD/MS/Dip .N.B in the subjects noted below:

Note 1: Candidates who have appeared or are appearing for the MD/MS examination can also apply and they should produce the PG Degree certificate at the time of counseling.

3.2.3 Registration: Candidates should have got their MBBS and PG Degrees registered permanently with State Medical Council [**T. C. Medical Council**] and it should be submitted at the time of counseling.

3.3 Age: 1. General merit candidates : No upper age limit

3.4 All candidates, including service quota candidates, shall have to qualify the Entrance Examination conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Kerala by securing minimum of 50% marks for either Paper I or Paper II (40% marks for either Paper I or Paper II for SEBC and SC/ST candidates).SEBC,SC/ST candidates are eligible for relaxation of marks for qualifying the Entrance Examination only. There is no reservation of seats for SEBC and SC/ST candidates.

3.4.1 Claim for relaxation of marks under SEBC

3.4.1(a) Candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as per G.O.(P) No.208/66/Edn. Dated 2.5.1966 and GO (P) No.1/2015/BCDD dated 01/01/2015 should produce a certificate to the extent that the candidates belongs to the community which is designated as a Socially and Educationally Backward Class and does not belong to the category of Creamy layer, in the proforma given as **Annexure V** of the prospectus. Only the claims of the candidates of those communities that are included in the SEBC list as **Annexure III** will be considered. Claims by candidates belonging to other communities, which are not included in the list, will be rejected even if certificates from the concerned Revenue Officers have been obtained and furnished along with the application form. **Candidates claiming relaxation of marks under SEBC Quota should invariably produce Non-Creamy layer Certificate from the Village Officer concerned. The above certificate should be obtained in the prescribed format along with the printout of the application itself.** The candidature/allotment/admission of the candidates who furnish fake Non-Creamy layer certificate is liable to be cancelled. Such candidates are also liable to be debarred from appearing for the allotment/admission process for a period extending up to two years.

3.4.1(b) Relaxation of marks under SEBC for children of inter-caste married couples: Children of Inter caste married couple with either the father or mother or both belonging to a community included in SEBC list, are eligible for reservation under SEBC. Such candidates should furnish a Non-Creamy layer certificate specifying the community of the candidate from the Village Officer in the proforma available along with the printout of the application. Candidates with father and mother belonging to different communities, both of which are included in the SEBC list, can avail communal reservation under any one of the communities of their parents, **to be mentioned by the candidate** in the relevant column of the online application. (For example a candidate born out of inter-caste marriage between an Ezhava and a Muslim can claim the reservation benefit applicable either to Ezhava or Muslim only and not against both). **The claim made in the online Application will be final and cannot be changed subsequently.**

3.4.1(c) The List of SEBC Communities is given in **Annexure III**

3.4.2 Claim for Relaxation of marks under Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes Candidates

3.4.2(a) Candidates claiming relaxation of marks under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota should obtain the Caste/Community Certificate from a Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tahsildar, **in the format obtained along the printout of application.** The Christian converts who have subsequently embraced Hinduism should produce Caste/Community Certificate in the proforma provided along with the printout of the application. The following certificate should also be got recorded by the Revenue Official below the Certificate issued :- **“The Certificate is issued after observing the guidelines issued in Government Circular No. 18421/E2/SCST DD dated 15-12-1987”** .

3.4.2(b) The applications of Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes candidates which do not contain SC/ST Certificates (Community Certificate) from the Tahsildar in the prescribed form provided along with the printout of the application will not be considered on any account for claiming community relaxation of marks for SC/ST candidates - vide G.O.(Ms)No. 31/90/SC ST DD dated 25-05-1990. The community certificate should clearly specify that the candidate himself/herself (not the father or mother) belongs to the Scheduled Castes/Tribes. The Community Certificates obtained earlier for other purposes will not be accepted. The candidates who are reconverted to Hinduism from Christianity of Scheduled Caste origin should produce community certificate from the Tahsildar concerned along with a copy of Gazette Notification regarding re-conversion.

3.4.2(c) The claim for relaxation of marks under Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribes Quota will also be subject to verification and clearance by the Screening committee constituted for the purpose by Government vide G.O.(P) No.19/2002/ SCSTDD dated 20-04-2002 and as authorised by section 6 of the Kerala (Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes) Regulation of issue of Community Certificates Act - 1996 (Act 11 of 1996).

3.4.2(d) The SC/ST claims in respect of those who have migrated from one State to another will be subject to the provisions of GO (Ms)No.10/86/SCSTDD Dated 12-02-1986. Only the children of those who had migrated to this State before the promulgation of the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order 1950 and the constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order 1950, and ordinarily reside in this State can claim SC/ST benefits from the State of Kerala. They must be able to prove this if required.

3.4.2(e) SC/ST status of children of parents contracted inter-caste marriage will be subject to the orders/clarification issued in G.O(Ms) No.11/05/SCSTDD dated 22.03.2005, G.O(Ms) No.25/05/SCSTDD dated 20.06.2005 and the judgment dated 10.08.2005 of the Full Bench of the Honorable High Court of Kerala in WP 2483/2005 and connected cases. Their SC/ST claim will be subject to verification and clearance by the Screening Committee constituted by the Government vide G.O.(P) No.19/2002/ SCSTDD dated 20-04-2002. The application of such candidates for the relaxation of marks of SC/ST which do not contain Certificate from the Tahsildar concerned in the prescribed form provided along with the printout of the application will not be considered on any account. **The Community Certificate should clearly specify that the candidate himself/herself (not the father/mother) belongs to the Scheduled Castes/Tribes.** There is no separate reservation quota for the children born of Inter caste married couples of whom one is a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe.

3.4.2(f) WARNING

Those who produce false SC/ST certificate for claiming relaxation of marks under SC/ST shall be liable for the penalties stipulated in section 15 of the act referred to in the clause 6-4.1(3). Candidates and their guardians who make such applications are warned that in addition to prosecution they will have to suffer the following consequences in case the SC/ST certificate produced is found to be false and the candidate does not belong to any SC/ST Communities under Section 16 of the Act: “Benefits secured on the basis of false community certificates to be withdrawn.

- 3.4.2(f)(i) Whoever not being a person belonging to any of the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes secured admission in any educational institution against a seat reserved for such castes or tribes or secures any appointment in the Government, Government undertakings, Local Authority or in any other Company or Corporation owned or controlled by the Government or in any aided institutions against a post reserved for such castes or tribes or enjoys any other benefits intended exclusively for such castes or tribes by producing a false Community Certificate shall, on cancellation of the false Community Certificate, be removed by canceling the irregular admission in the concerned educational institutions, or as the case may be removed from the said service forthwith and any benefit enjoyed by him as aforesaid shall be withdrawn forthwith.
- 3.4.2(f)(ii) Any amount paid to such person by Government or any other agency by way of scholarship, grant, allowance, stipend or any other financial benefit shall be recovered as if it is an arrear of public revenue due on land.
- 3.4.2(f)(iii) Any Degree or any other educational qualifications acquired by such person after securing admission in any educational institution on the basis of a false community certificate shall also stand cancelled on cancellation of the community certificate obtained by him”.

4. DURATION OF THE COURSE

- 4.1 Duration of the course shall be **3 years** from the date of commencement of the course.
- 4.2 All candidates shall complete 3 years from their date of joining the course
- 4.3 The date of commencement of the course will be 01.08.2016 or as decided by Govt.of India/Medical Council of India/Supreme Court of India
- 4.4 All candidates are required to obtain a minimum of 80% attendance each year before Promotion to the next year.
- 4.5 Extension for the leave taken in an year may be done in the same year itself.
- 4.6 Final attendance will be calculated taking the average for the three years.

5. SELECTION & ALLOTMENT

- 5.1 The selection of the candidate will be made on merit through an Entrance Examination conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examination, Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram.
- 5.2 [The Commissioner of Entrance Examination Kerala will prepare and forward the rank list of the candidate who has **qualified** for the Entrance Examination to the Director of Medical Education.]
- 5.3 The Director of Medical Education will do the allotment for the candidate as per the rank under general merit and Service quota.

7.1 Distribution of available seat with different categories is given below:

7.2 Out of 100 seats available under various specialties 4 seats will be set apart for faculty in the concerned specialties under the Medical Education service, 24 seats for those serving under Health Service Department and 4 seats under Insurance Medical Service. The rest of the seats (68) will be distributed under General merit.

8. SEATS UNDER SERVICE QUOTA

Seats for the Service candidates will be allotted under Three quotas. Medical Education Service Quota (MESQ). Health Service Quota (HSQ) and Insurance Medical Service Quota (IMSQ). The order of preference for service quota will be MESQ – HSQ -IMSQ

8.1 Eligibility for Service Quota-

8.1.1 All candidates including Service quota candidates shall have to appear for and qualify the Entrance Examination conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Kerala by securing minimum qualifying marks as per Clause 3.4. Candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally backward Classes as per G.O (P) No.208/66/Edn.Dated 02.05.1966, whose annual family income [i.e, annual income for the financial year 2015-2016 as per GO (Ms) No.03/2014/BCDD dated 09/01/2014 of all members in the family inclusive of the income of the applicant and spouse (in the case of married candidates) from all sources taken together] is up to Rs.6 lakhs (Rupees Six Lakhs only) are eligible for relaxation of marks needed for qualifying the exam. There is no reservation of seats for SEBC/SC/ST candidates.

8.1.2 For applying under Service Quota, the applicants should be regular staff under **Director of Health Services (DHS)/ Director of Medical Education(DME)/ Director of Insurance Medical Services (DIMS)** and should have a minimum effective service of 5 years in the case of HSQ/IMSQ candidates and 2 years in the case of MESQ candidates as on the

date of notification for inviting application. If eligible candidates are not available in MESQ/HSQ/IMSQ, candidates who have less than required seniority will be considered for that seat, and if so, **the period of bond will be extended by the number of years equal to shortage for eligibility.**

8.1.3 For applying under MES Quota, the applicants should be regular teachers of the Medical Education Service under **the concerned Specialty** in which they are eligible to apply for MCH/DM as the case may be.

8.1.4 Health Service candidates can also apply to the specialties in addition to those which are Specifically earmarked for HSQ and such candidates will be considered to the vacant seats if any under MES Quota in that specialty. **(A candidate can apply for admission to a maximum of three courses only.)** If seats become unclaimed in Medical Education Service Quota, in any specialty, it shall be offered to eligible candidates in HSQ and IMSQ. If seats become unclaimed in HSQ, it shall be offered to IMSQ

MESQ → HSQ → IMSQ

If seats become unclaimed in Health Service Quota, it shall be offered to eligible candidates in IMSQ. If seats become unclaimed in IMSQ, it shall be offered to MESQ

HSQ → IMSQ → MESQ

If seats become unclaimed in Insurance Medical Service Quota, it shall be offered to eligible candidates in MESQ. If seats become unclaimed in MESQ, it shall be offered to HSQ.

IMSQ → MESQ → HSQ

“If still there are unclaimed seats in any of the Service Quota categories, those vacant Seats will go to General Merit.”

- Note:**
- i. Candidates who have undergone PG course under MESQ/ Tutor/Lecturer trainee scheme once will also be considered for selection to Super specialty courses under MES Quota. However, Lecturer trainee/deputation benefit will not be allowed for a second time for candidates coming under service quota from MESQ/HSQ/IMSQ i.e. they will be permitted to avail the benefit of service quota, for admission purpose only.
 - ii. **Service candidates who are selected for the Super Specialty Course under service quota and who relinquish the course or fail to join the course / discontinue the course after joining will not be eligible for applying to the course under Service quota in future.**

9. How and when to apply:

9.1 Application for P G Super Speciality Entrance Examination-2016 (PGSS-2016): –

All candidates (including Service Quota) seeking admission to the courses should apply through the online application provided in the website www.cee.kerala.gov.in of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations and the application fee can be paid through online payment. Those having an Internet banking account, Credit card or Debit card can make use of the facility. Candidates availing this facility should read and follow each of the instructions given in the website carefully in order to ensure that the payment is successful. The candidates can also remit the application fee by way of a Demand Draft for the requisite amount, drawn from any Nationalized Bank *in favour of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, payable at Thiruvananthapuram.*

Application fee for General candidates is **Rs.2500/-**(Rupees Two Thousand and Five Hundred only) and in the case of SC/ST candidates and those eligible for SC/ST benefits as per G.O (Ms) No.25/05/SCSTDD dated 20.06.2005 is **Rs.1000/-**(Rupees One Thousand only). The application forms and the prospectus will not be available from the Medical Colleges or from the office of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. Service candidate seeking admission in General Quota also, should pay extra amount of Rs.1500/-.(Rupees One Thousand and Five Hundred only)

9.2 Step-wise procedure on how to apply using Online Application Form:

9.2.1 The candidate has to visit www.cee.kerala.gov.in wherein he/she can find the link ‘PG Super Speciality 2016 -Online Application’ .

9.2.2 **Candidate Registration:** This is a one time online process during which the candidates will get a system generated ‘Application Number’. The candidates should give necessary basic data and create a strong password during the registration process. A strong password should consist of a minimum 8 characters containing at least one alphabet, one numerical digit and one symbol.

Note: The applicant has to remember the application number and password till the end of the admission process. Keep the password strictly confidential.

9.2.3 **Candidate Login:** The candidate has to give the Application number and the Password created during registration and on clicking the ‘Login’, he/she will be directed to the homepage of the candidate.

9.2.4 **Filling up of Online Application form:** The candidate has to click the link ‘Fill-up Application’. The data entry can be made only after uploading his/her photograph. The soft copy of photograph as specified below is to be selected using the browse button and uploaded.

Photograph:-A studio generated soft copy of latest passport size color photograph with light coloured background in jpeg format between 15 kb to 30 kb of size and resolution 150 x 200 pixels is to be used for uploading. The photograph should not be taken with the candidate wearing Cap or Goggles. Spectacles are allowed if being used regularly. POLAROID and COMPUTER /MOBILE-PHONE generated photos are not acceptable. A printed copy of passport size photograph (same as that uploaded online) should be firmly pasted in the space provided in the printout of application.

9.2.5 Fill in all the mandatory fields of online application carefully and correctly.

9.2.6 On completing the data entry, make sure that all the entries made are correct in all respect and read the Declaration given. The declaration is meant to state that all details entered by the candidate are true and no corrections will be requested in future. Then click the ‘Save & Preview’ button placed below the ‘Declaration’ by the candidate.

Some preliminary validations on the data entered will be done during this stage. If all the mandatory fields are properly entered then a page showing the details entered by the candidate will appear. Otherwise message(s) about incomplete/unfilled field will be displayed. If so, fill the indicated mandatory fields correctly and click the ‘Save & Preview’ button again. The lower part of the

resulting page showing details of the candidate will contain two buttons “**Final submission**” and “**Edit**”.

*Once the “**Final submission**” button is pressed it will not be possible to edit/ modify/ correct any details* entered. If any of the details submitted are found incorrect, the candidature of the candidate will be cancelled. Therefore, before pressing the “**Final submission**” button thoroughly verify the correctness of all the filled in details. Click the “**Final submission**” button only if fully satisfied with the data else click “**Edit**” Button and edit/modify the details as required. Only after making required modification the “**Final submission**” button is to be clicked.

On clicking the “**Final submission**” the application will be saved and the candidate will be directed to the homepage of the candidate wherein the facility for ‘**Payment of Application fee**’ is activated .

- 9.2.7** Application fee can be paid through online payment. However candidates can also remit the requisite application fee in the form of Demand Draft drawn from any Nationalized Bank in favor of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, payable at Thiruvananthapuram. The **Demand Draft in original**’ has to be sent along with the application to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. In case of online payment, the payment reference number will be automatically registered in the application, whereas, for Demand Draft payments, the payment details will have to be filled - in when asked for after the “**Final submission**” so as to be able to proceed to the ‘Print application’ stage.
- 9.2.8** Take the printouts of the Application Form and other documents only by clicking on the links provided.
- 9.2.9** In the printout of filled in application form, fix passport size photograph(same as the one uploaded) in the space provided and obtain necessary certificates as mentioned in Clause 9.5.
- 9.2.10** In the print out of application, the candidate has to
- i. put his/her signature where-ever necessary
 - ii. affix the left hand thumb impression in the space provided (As per the instructions in the online application) and send the same along with relevant documents by Registered Post/Speed Post/Hand Delivery to the **Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Vth Floor, Upper Zone, Housing Board Buildings, Santhi Nagar, Thiruvananthapuram - 695 001** before the time and date notified by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The application submitted by the candidates should be complete in all respects and the certificates produced after the last date of receipt will not be considered on any ground. Late and defective applications will not be considered by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. Admit cards will be issued to only those candidates whose copy of application (in full and as required) is received in the office of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on or before the last date notified.
- 9.2.11** The candidates are advised to keep a photocopy of the printout of the application (complete with photo, signatures and thumb impression) and keep it with him/her for reference.
- 9.2.12** Use ‘**Print Application**’ link for taking further copies of application if

necessary.

9.3 Points to be remembered:

- 9.3.1 Candidates must upload a copy of their passport size photograph same as the one to be affixed to the printout of the online application for PG Super Speciality Entrance Examination-2016. (Only after uploading the photograph, the candidate will be able to fill in his/her online application.)
- 9.3.2 Candidates will not be able to correct/modify/edit his/her application once the 'Confirm' button is pressed. Only after pressing the 'Confirm' button the page containing 'Print' link will be available.
- 9.3.3 Candidates must pay the required application fee through online payment. However candidates can also remit the requisite application fee in the form of *Demand Draft drawn from any Nationalised Bank in favour of Commissioner for Entrance Examination payable at Thiruvananthapuram.*
- 9.3.4 All applications sent to the Office of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations are to be printed using 'Print' link.
- 9.3.5 Candidates should not send more than one application form to the CEE.
- 9.3.6 Incomplete /late /defective applications will be summarily rejected.
- 9.3.7 Certificate for category claims should be in the Prescribed format and will be considered only if sent along with the printout of the Online Application.

Note: A candidate can apply for admission to a maximum of three courses. The General Merit candidates should indicate the order of preference for the courses chosen by them in the application form. The choice once exercised will be final.

9.4 Application of Service quota candidates: - The service quota candidates should complete all the procedures mentioned in clause 9.1, 9.2 & 9.3. Moreover they should also forward a copy of the application form along with copies of all required documents related to their service and service details from the Accountant General, to the Controlling Officer concerned (DME/DHS/DIMS).

9.5. Certificates/Documents to be attached along with the application form.

Self Attested Xerox copies of the following documents:

- (i) M.B.B.S. Degree Certificate.
- (ii) Post Graduate Degree /Dip.N.B Certificate*.

*Candidates who have appeared or are appearing for the MD/MS/DipNB Examination should produce the PG Degree Certificates at the time of counseling.

- (iii) Certificate to prove age.
- (iv) *Original Nativity Certificate as per Clause 3.1.1/ Indian Passport/Election ID issued by the Election Commission of India.SC/ST/SEBC candidate as per Clause 3.1.3 should attach relevant page of the Secondary School Leaving Certificate / Indian Passport / Birth certificate showing the candidate's or either of the parent's place of birth in Kerala to prove nativity. In case certificate of parent is attached, corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate should also be attached.*
- (v) Original Demand Draft (In case of application fee payment in the form of DD).

- (vi) Any other Certificate required along with the application .
- (vii) *For applicants who have undergone M.B.B.S./PG Degree/Dip.N.B Course in the Medical Colleges in India, a certificate to that effect obtained from the Principal of the Medical College, where he/she has studied, will be accepted for nativity claim as per clause 3.1.2*

9.6 Additional Certificate(s) to be submitted along with the application form by **Service candidates:**

- a) 'No Objection Certificate' from the employer. (See Note (i) given below).
- b) Service details from the Accountant General.
- c) 'Declaration' regarding Lecturer Quota Trainee benefit availed previously.

Note: In the case of Health Service candidates and Insurance Medical Service Candidates a certificate from the DHS/DIMS to the effect that they have no objection for the candidate applying to the course and that he/she will be relieved of the present duties if he/she is selected for the course has to be submitted with the application.

10. ENTRANCE EXAMINATION:

All candidates seeking admission for the P.G Super Specialty Courses will have to appear for the Entrance Examination conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations [CEE]. The Entrance Examination will be conducted by the CEE, in accordance with the Schedule fixed by the MCI. The date and time of the Entrance examination will be announced by the CEE in due course.

10.1 Scheme of Examination: The entrance examination will consist of Two Papers, each of one and half hours duration and containing 90 Objective Type [Multiple Choice] questions. **Appearance in both Paper I and Paper II of the Entrance examination is compulsory for admission to the course.**

10.2 The Syllabus of Paper I will be different for the candidate appearing for Medical Superspeciality and for those appearing for Surgical Superspecialities.

The question pattern of **Paper I** for Medical Super Specialties will cover the questions on the following subjects at the Post Graduate level.

The question pattern of **Paper I** for *Surgical Super Specialties* will cover the questions on the following subjects at the Post Graduate level.

i) General Surgery	-	72 questions
ii) Basic pathology	-	9 questions
iii) Anesthesia	-	9 questions

	Total	90 questions.

Paper II will cover the questions in the Super Speciality subjects of the course, which will also be at the Post Graduate level.

10.3 There will be a single version for the question paper, which will be in the form of a booklet. For each question, four suggested responses will be given as choices A, B, C and D, of which only one will be the **most appropriate answer** and the candidate, has to select, and mark the bubble corresponding to the *most appropriate response* in the separate OMR Answer Sheets provided. *All entries in the OMR Sheet, including filling of bubbles should be done using ballpoint pen only. (Blue or Black) .*

10.4 Scoring Scheme: Each answer with correct response will be awarded **4 (Four)** marks.

Negative marking will be adopted for incorrect response. One mark will be deducted for each incorrect response and zero mark will be given for the question not answered. More than one answer indicated against a question will be deemed as incorrect response and will be negatively marked.

A fully computerized system has been adopted for the evaluation of the Answer Scripts, using the Optical Mark Reading (OMR) System and for the preparation of the Rank List. **There is no provision for revaluation or rechecking of answer sheets.**

10.4.1 Important: (i) At the end of the examination, candidate should hand over the OMR Answer Sheet and Question Booklet to the invigilator, who will separate the Answer Sheet along the perforation in the presence of the candidate. Candidates will be permitted to take the Question Booklet with them after the Examination.

10.4.2 Candidate will not be permitted to take items such as Pencil, eraser, correction fluid, calculator electronic gadgets, mobile phones etc. in to the examination hall. Any malpractice or attempt to commit any kind of malpractice in the examination will result in the disqualification of the candidate and will be debarred for a period not less than two years.

10.4.3: Key Complaints: If a candidate has any complaint regarding the answer keys/questions, the same should be submitted to the CEE, in writing along with supporting documents and a fee of **Rs.500/- for each question or answer key being challenged**, by way of DD in favour of Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Payable at Thiruvananthapuram, within the notified time from the date of publication of answer keys on the website of the CEE. If the complaint filed is found to be genuine, the fee remitted while filing the complaint will be refunded. Complaints received after the stipulated date and without requisite fee will not be

considered under any circumstances. Complaints received by E-mail/Fax will not be considered on any account.

10.5 Resolution of Tie: If more than one candidate obtains equal marks in the Entrance Examination, tie will be resolved as follows:-

- (i) Candidate with higher marks in Paper II will be ranked higher.
- (ii) If the tie still persists candidates with less number of negative marks will be ranked higher.
- (iii) If the tie still persists, the age of the candidate will be taken into account, the older being given preference.

Note: 50% marks for either Paper I or Paper II will be the qualifying marks. For the

purpose of ranking of the candidates, marks obtained by the candidates for both the papers will be taken.

11. RANK LIST & SELECTION

11.1 The Commissioner for Entrance Examination will prepare and publish the Select and Wait list of General Merit and Service quota Candidates based on merit and forward the same to the Director of Medical Education.

11.2 The selection of General Merit and service quota candidates to the course will be on the basis of the rank obtained in the Entrance Examination.

11.3 The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will *prepare a rank list of respective service quota candidates, who have qualified the entrance examination, based on their merit.*

11.4 The subjectwise Select and Wait list of Service candidates will be prepared on the basis of the preference of subjects exercised by the applicants and on the basis of rank at the time of personal appearance.

11.5 The Rank List published by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will be valid till **31st August 2016**. Commencement of academic year is **01-08-2016**. The validity of the select list is subject to variation as per decision of the court or Medical Council of India.

12. ALLOTMENT

12.1 Candidates will be allowed to exercise their option for the course and college of study as per their ranks in the order of priority given below.

12.2 **General**

12.2.1 The allotment to the courses will be made through counseling for which the candidates will be called for personal appearance. The date, time and venue of counseling will be published in all leading dailies and in other Medias and in the website www.dme.kerala.gov.in. **No individual communication will be served for the candidates for appearing the counseling.**

12.2.2 **Candidates who do not turn up for the allotment as per schedule, at the place and time notified, will forfeit their chance for admission, and will not be considered for admission in future or arising vacancies, irrespective of the rank.** However, if a candidate is not able to attend the allotment process on genuine grounds, the parent/guardian, or any authorized person can act as a proxy at the risk of the candidate on production of authorization letter down loaded from the website.

12.2.3 Memo will be issued to the candidates who take allotment. The candidate has to report to the college in which he/she is allotted on the date fixed by the Director of Medical Education at the time of counseling. No extension of time for reporting to the college will be granted under any circumstances. The candidates who got selection will have to remit the fees applicable to the course to which they are allotted, at the time of admission in the concerned Medical College.

12.2.4 **No transfer or change of college will be allowed after the closing of admission.**

Transfers before closing of admission will be done only through counseling. Transfer of a service quota candidate to general merit seat and vice versa will not be considered.

12.2.5 The applicant shall write the choice of priority. If the applicant is allotted 1st choice, failure to accept the allotment will lead to removal from the allotment process. If the person becomes eligible for two specialties, he/she will take the 1st specialty opted for.

12.2.6 Spot Allotment

Candidates who have obtained admission in Government merit seats for a course in any of the Government Medical colleges shall not be eligible to participate in the spot allotment for the same subject in other Government Medical colleges. Similarly candidates who have obtained admission in Government merit seats for a course in any of the Self Financing Medical colleges shall not be eligible to participate in the spot allotment for the same subject in other Self Financing Medical colleges. However a candidate who got admission in Government merit seat of a Self Financing Medical college shall be permitted to take admission in the same/other subject in a Government Medical through spot allotment. Allotment once made at the Spot shall be final and cannot be changed or cancelled.

12.3 Documents to be produced at the time of Counselling

- (a) Admit card of the Entrance Examination issued by the CEE.
- (b) Originals of documents mentioned in clause 9.5 (i) to (iii)

- (c) Permanent Registration Certificate from T.C. Medical Council.
- (d) Certificate of Eligibility / Equivalency of the qualifying examination from KUHS in the case of candidates who have passed their Post Graduate Degree courses from Universities outside Kerala.
- (e) Transfer certificate from the college last studied
- (f) If a candidate has joined an another institution and surrendered the certificates there, a possession Certificate **from head of the institution** may be produced at the time of counselling and originals to be submitted at the time of admission in the concerned institution.

12.4 Unfilled Seats: Any seat falling vacant in Service Quota will be filled up as laid down in clause 8.1.4. Any seat falling vacant in General merit Quota will be filled by MESQ/HSQ/IMSQ respectively.

13. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES & EXECUTION OF BOND

13.1 The applicants selected for the Super Speciality Courses have to execute two bonds as in clause 13.1.1 and 13.1.2 or 13.1.3 below in stamped paper (all pages of the bond should be in stamped paper) of the total value of Rs.200 of Kerala stamp paper each at the time of joining the course to the effect that :

13.1.1 He/she shall not discontinue the Super Speciality Courses he/she has been allotted to after the validity period of the Rank List (i.e., August 31, 2016). If a student discontinues the Super Speciality Courses after the validity period of the rank list, he/she shall pay **Rs. 2/-Crores** (Rs. Two crores only) as Liquidated damages and also the stipend /salary already received.

13.1.2 In the case of Service Quota Candidates, he / she shall serve the Government ~~for~~ for a period of 10 years or up to superannuation, whichever is earlier, after the completion of the course. They will carry out their compulsory post PGSS service in the department to which they have their lien. However if adequate facilities are not available in that service, Government will have the right to shift them to any department/institution on the choice of Government. During that period they will be considered as on deputation. If any service candidate violates this clause, it will be construed as professional misconduct and the fact reported to the T.C. Medical Council for suitable action including cancellation of registration by the council. His/Her service will be terminated and a penalty of **Rs. 2 Crore** (Rs. Two Crore only) will also be levied in addition to termination of service.

Service quota candidates from Insurance Medical service will be posted on deputation in any service or wherever needed, till adequate facilities are provided in their parent department. These candidates will also have to participate in sabarimala and VIP duties as and when solicited.

13.1.3 All other candidates will serve the Government of Kerala in Health Service/ Medical Education Service for a period not less than three years continuously after the completion of the course. Even if any candidate had undergone bonded service

earlier, after the completion of the PGSS course, they shall serve MES for a period of 3 years. This compulsory service shall be continuous and shall not be waived for higher studies or for regular employment unless in the service of the Government of Kerala through Kerala Public service Commission. In the event of getting a regular post, quitting or relinquishment of the new post shall be permitted only after completing the remaining compulsory service, failing which liquidated damages shall be paid. If anyone violates this condition, it will be construed as professional misconduct and the fact reported to the T. C. Medical Council for suitable action including cancellation of registration by the Council. A penalty of **Rs. 2 Crore** (Rs. Two Crore only) will also be levied.

- 13.2. A candidate leaving one course to join another of his /her higher option, during the validity period of the Rank List shall not be liable to pay the Liquidated damages, and is eligible **for refund of Tuition fee & Caution Deposit remitted for the course.**
- 13.3 No admission shall be made without getting the bonds as prescribed in Annexure I & II of the prospectus at the time of joining. **No stipend shall be paid to the candidate who does not execute the bond.** Format of bond will be available in the office of Principal of the Medical College concerned. Bonds furnished in another format will not be accepted. Any lapse in this regard will be treated as the personal liability of the Principal concerned.
- 13.4 The parents/guardians/husband/wife shall stand as sureties. The signature of the candidate and the sureties have to be attested by a Gazetted officer of state/central Government or Grama/Block/District/Panchayath President/ Municipal Chairperson/ Mayor or MLA/MP, by countersigning in the bond agreement as a witness.
- 13.5 The certificates which are to be submitted in the colleges at the time of admission will be released only after the completion of compulsory bonded service or in the case of bond violation, the liquidated damages are paid.
- 13.6 If Govt. is not in a position to offer job either under Medical Education Services or Health Services to fulfill the Compulsory Government Service as per the bonded obligation within one year after completion of the course, the candidates will be absolved of the bonded obligation. Governments have power to use their services (if required) through recruitment boards (e.g. KPSC) or by direct recruitment on contract basis whichever is deemed fit as per the circumstances prevailing at the time.

14. PREVENTIVE MEASURES AGAINST RAGGING

According to the Kerala prohibition of Ragging Act 1998, ragging means doing of any act by disorderly conduct to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or shame or embarrassment to /that student and includes teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or to perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course be willing to do.

All institutions will have to abide by the directives of the Honorable Supreme Court of India, Dated 16/05/2007 in SLP No(S) 24295/2006 University of Kerala Vs Council, Principal's, colleges, Kerala and ors (with SLP(c) No.24296.99/2004 and W.P (Crl) No.173/2006 and SLP(c) No.14356/2005) and the recommendations approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India on effective prevention of ragging in educational institutions.

In case, the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution. It shall be collective responsibility of the authority of the institution to see to it that effective steps for preventing ragging are taken. Anti-ragging committees and anti ragging squads will have to be formed to take effective measures against ragging and they should adhere to the stipulations and effectively monitor and comply with the directives. Each of the students of the institution and his/her parents, or guardian are required to submit a combined undertaking at the time of registration/admission in prescribed format available in Annexure XII which is mandatory for the registration/admission.

5. GENERAL

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Prospectus, the Government may at any time of their own accord or otherwise, revise or amend any order passed by the subordinate authority.
