ORDER

As per G.O read above, Government have fixed the fee structure for admission to BDS courses in self-financing Dental colleges. The All Kerala Self-financing Dental College Management Consortium have expressed their willingness to enter into a consensual agreement with Government to admit students for the BDS course for the academic year 2016-17 in the member colleges. Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to enter into a consensual agreement with the All Kerala Self-financing Dental College Management Consortium for BDS admission for the academic year 2016-17 in the member colleges listed below with the terms and conditions hereunder:

WHEREAS the Consortium and Member Colleges has participated in the discussions has expressed their desire to arrive at a consensus with the Government in respect of admission of students to the above colleges, collection of fees and refundable interest free deposit from the students admitted in their college;

AND WHEREAS such consensual agreement is within the framework of law as contemplated in various decisions rendered by the Honorable Supreme Court of India;

AND WHEREAS the Government and the Member Colleges has arrived at a consensus to fulfill the above objective by entering into an agreement for the academic year 2016-2017;

AND WHEREAS the Member Colleges has resolved to enter into an agreement with Government in respect of admission and collection of fees from students admitted for BDS course 2016-2017 in their college on the following terms and conditions:

NOW THE AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:-

1. 50% of total seats in the Member Colleges will be filled up by the Member Colleges as allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE) from the list prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations who have qualified in the Kerala Engineering Agriculture Medical Entrance Examination 2016 (KEAM 2016), in accordance with merit and reservation principles followed by Government from time to time, subject to clause 2 below
2. Whereas the Member Colleges has minority status, 30% seats out of the above 50% seats (ie, 15 seats out of 100 seats) will be filled up by the Member Colleges from the list prepared by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations by the students belonging to the minority community which established the college based on their *inter se* merit.
3. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the list of the students to be admitted in the Member Colleges and the Member Colleges shall admit the students specified in the list. The students in the list will be given specific instructions as to the date and time of presentation before the college for admission, the amount of fees to be paid and the record to be submitted at the

time of admission. The Member Colleges need admit only those students who have complied with the instructions as required by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations.

4. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will allot only such students for admission to a college who have opted for that college. The CEE shall furnish the final allotment list of the students to be admitted to the Member Colleges on or before the 26th day of September 2016. The CEE will not re-allot students already allotted to a College and admitted in the College either by the CEE or the Member Colleges, after this final allotment. The Students must join the college by 26.09.2016 at 5 PM.
5. The Member Colleges shall be entitled to fill up those seats still remaining unfilled after the closure of allotment by the CEE. These unfilled seats from Government side shall be filled up by the CEE up to 5 PM on 26th day of September 2016. Those seats still remaining vacant after 5 PM on 26th day of September 2016 are reverted back to the Member Colleges as Additional Management seats and the Member Colleges can fill up those seats as Management Seats from eligible candidates from the rank list of NEET 2016.
6. The Government shall not have any claim over such seats after 26th day of September 2016 and the forfeited seats shall not be brought forward to succeeding year for compensation.
7. The member colleges agreed to collect annual fees at the following concessional rates from the students admitted under the 50% Government merit quota during the entire course period.
 - a. 14% of the candidates from among those allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in each Institution coming under BPL families as per Kerala State norms irrespective of rank or category need only pay an annual tuition of ₹ 23,000 (Rupees Twenty three thousand only). If enough number of candidates belonging to BPL category as above are not available, the balance number of candidates will be allowed concessional fees of ₹ 23,000 (Rupees Twenty three thousand only) per annum to be selected from among those allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examination in each institution from those having lower family income, irrespective rank or category with the total number of BPL student eligible for concessional fees not exceeding 14% as above. However, SC/ST category of candidates, who already enjoy fee concession benefits will not be considered for the above purpose.
 - b. 26% of candidates who have been allowed SEBC status by the Commissioner for Entrance Examination in each institution shall pay an annual tuition fee of ₹ 44,000 (Rupees Fourty four thousand only). They will be selected on the basis of the rank. However, if the required number of SEBC candidates is not available among the students allotted by the CEE in the institution, the remaining number of candidates will be selected from among the general

category on the basis of income, irrespective of rank or category as explained in clause (a), with the total number of SEBC students eligible for concessional fee not exceeding 26% as above.

c. The same principle as explained in clause (a) and (b) is applicable to the minority institutions also.

d. All other candidates as explained in clause (a), (b) & SC/ST shall pay an annual tuition fee of Rs.2,10,000/- (Rupees Two Lakh Ten Thousand only). The fee benefits will be granted only after the closure of allotments to Private Self financing Dental Colleges. Hence candidates (except SC/ST) allotted to these institutions will have to remit the fee of Rs.2,10,000/- provisionally at the time of the allotment directly to the Member Colleges. The CEE will deduct only Rs.10,000/- from the students mentioned above and this amount will be transferred to the Member Colleges within 45 days of admission, failing which the Member Colleges can claim interest on the payment.

e. Annual fee for SC/ST students shall be paid by the Government to the concerned college, at the rate of uniform fees fixed by the Government.

8. The annual fees fixed as above shall be the complete tuition fee per annum payable for five years. However, the Educational Agency shall be entitled to collect from every student admitted to the College irrespective of whether they have been allotted by CEE under reservation or otherwise, Caution Deposit of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) and other expenses and such other permitted amounts, from students joining in the College. The College can also collect from students their proportionate share of fees payable to the Universities, Government fees, Dental Council of India fees, transportation charges, examination conducting charges, establishment charges, other statutory charges, etc. Such fees and amounts shall be specifically listed out and published each year by the Member Colleges. The Member Colleges will ensure that no consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any students admitted to the Member Colleges. Member Colleges shall not collect any amount from any student so admitted, other than those specified above.

9. The remaining 50% of the seats shall be filled up by the Educational Agency by the following methods.

a. The Member Colleges are entitled to fill up 15% seats in the NRI category by admitting NEET qualified students who are children/dependents of Non Resident Indians, as per the

conditions stipulated in GO(MS)No.34/2013/H&FWD dated 05.02.2013 and GO(MS)No.243/2014/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014. The Member Colleges can collect up to Rs.6,00,000/-(Rupees Six Lakhs only) per annum for five years as fees from NRI candidates thus admitted. In addition to this the Member Colleges can collect an amount not exceeding one year tuition fee, ie, Rs.6,00,000/-(Rupees Six Lakhs only) from the students in the category as interest free deposit. It shall be refunded at the end of the course without interest.

b. The Member Colleges shall be entitled to fill up the remaining 35% seats according to the merit list prepared on the basis of NEET 2016 based on inter-se merit. The Member Colleges will have the right to apportion the seats within this 35% to various categories or within the community or denominations thereof, based on inter-se merit.

c. 10% (5 seats out of 50) will be allotted to the dependents of Staff, Management and Trustees of the College based on the NEET qualified applications received by the Member Colleges.

d. Each Student thus admitted by the Member Colleges to the above mentioned 35% seats shall pay annual tuition fee up to Rs.5,00,000/-(Rupees Five Lakhs only) per annum for five years for which signed and sealed receipts shall be given by the Member Colleges. In addition to this the Member Colleges can collect an amount not exceeding one year tuition fee, ie, Rs.5,00,000/-(Rupees Five Lakhs only) from the students in the category as interest free deposit. It shall be refunded at the end of the course without interest. The Member Colleges shall be entitled to collect from every student admitted to the College under clause 9(a), (b) & (c) irrespective of whether they have been allotted by CEE under reservation or otherwise, Caution Deposit and other expenses and such other permitted amounts, from students joining in Educational Agency. The Member Colleges can also collect from students their proportionate share of fees payable to the Universities, Government fees, Dental Council of India fees, transportation charges, examination conducting charges, establishment charges, other statutory charges, etc. Such fees and amounts shall be specifically listed out and published each year by the member Colleges.

e. The Management seats still remaining vacant after 5 PM on 26th day of September 2016 are considered as Additional Management Seats and the Member College can fill up those seats from eligible candidates from the rank list of NEET 2016.

f. Each Student thus selected for admission shall remit the said amount as mentioned in clauses 9 (a) & (d) for the first year of the course and produce a bank guarantee from Nationalized Bank or Scheduled Bank for an amount covering the fee for the remaining four years, i.e. for the entire course of study. The Member Colleges is entitled to refuse admission to those candidates

who fail to submit/furnish bank guarantee at the time of admission.

10. The Member Colleges can retain the Tuition fee remitted by the student in the event the student admitted under the Management Quota or Government Quota, discontinues his/her studies for any reason at any time after 26th day of September 2016. Further, in case, any student admitted to any of the Member Colleges decides to cancel the admission for any reason whatsoever, the respective College shall be entitled to collect the tuition fee of the entire course. However, in the event of the seat so falling vacant being filled up by a new candidate, the tuition fee collected as per this clause shall be refunded to the student.
11. The Member Colleges undertakes that no consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any student admitted to the Member Colleges. It shall be the liability of the Member Colleges to redress complaints from the students, on any matter other than those covered by the terms and conditions of this agreement. Where the second party fails to redress any complaints referred to as above or on any matter covered under this agreement, it shall be the duty of the First party to take such steps as required under law to redress the complaints.
12. The Government shall arrange to provide PHC/CHC perceiving facilities at Govt. hospitals for five years and ensure supply of cadavers required for the Member Colleges as per the norms fixed by the Government. If any charges are applied by the Government for the facilities, the Member College is entitled to collect the same from the students on actual.
13. The Consensual Agreement entered into with the Educational Agency is valid for the Academic Year 2016-2017 only and shall not prejudicially affect the rights of the parties by virtue of the clauses herein, in respect of the cases pending before any court of law.
14. It shall be the duty of the first party to submit this consensual agreement before the Admission Supervisory Committee and Fee regulatory Committee constituted by the State for post facto approval.
15. The Educational Agency shall be entitled to collect uniform tuition fees for all seats not more than Rs.4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs only) excluding those admitted under NRI quota in the event of this consensual agreement is not approved as stipulated in Clause 14 above and not operative in its entirety or the consensual agreement or the fee structure mentioned in Clause 7 & 9 above are declared to be void or not enforceable by the Courts or any authority competent to declare so.
16. Nothing in the agreement shall be deemed as a surrender of the unconditional right of the Member Colleges or the Educational Agency regarding the admission of students in all the seats in

the colleges.

17. The Government shall arrange to provide to use the facilities of the Govt. General Hospitals for clinical training for five years for the Member Colleges.
18. Notwithstanding the conditions stated above any change/modification or new conditions added or existing conditions deleted on the mutual agreement with the Government subsequently, shall form the part of this agreement. Such Government Order/s shall have the same effect of the agreement reached between educational agency and the Government.


