#### **Abstract**

Health & Family Welfare Department – Self Financing Dental Colleges – NIMS – fees and admission of students during 2012-2013 - Sanction Accorded - Orders issued.-

## **HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE (S) DEPARTMENT**

Read:- Agreement dated 03.07.2012 entered into with Nooral Islam College of Dental Science and the Additional Secretary (Health & Family Welfare Department).

#### ORDER

Government have discussed the matter of allotment of seats and fees to be levied with the Nooral Islam College of Dental Science and an agreement has been executed with them for the admissions for the year 2012-13.

2. In the circumstances sanction is accorded to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations for including the Nooral Islam College of Dental Science who have executed an agreement with Government in respect of admission and collection of fees from students to be admitted for BDS Course for the year 2012-2013, in the list of Institutions for allotment of students subject to the terms and conditions specified below: -

#### 3. Terms and Conditions: -

- 1. 50% of the total seats in the college will be filled up by the Government from the list prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance examinations in accordance with merit and reservation principles followed by Government from time to time, subject to clauses 2 and 3 below.
- 2. The Government shall furnish the list of the students to be admitted in the college by the management and the management concerned shall admit the students specified in the list. The students in the list will be given specific instructions as to the date and time of presentation before the college for admission, the amount of fees to be paid, and the records to be submitted at the time of admission. The management concerned shall admit the students who have complied with the instructions as certified by the Government. The Government shall furnish such lists on or before the 20th day of September 2012.
- 3. If any student is not admitted by the management concerned for specific defects or for reasons to be recorded in writing, it shall intimate the Government the defects or reasons as the case may be and the Government shall rectify the defects or state the reasons for accepting the list or furnish a revised list which the management concerned shall accept and admit the students accordingly following the above procedures but in any case not later than 5 pm on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2012. The management concerned shall be entitled to fill those seats still remaining unfilled after 20<sup>th</sup> September. The

- Government shall not have any claim over such seats after 20<sup>th</sup> September 2012 and the forfeited seats shall not be brought forward to succeeding year for compensation.
- 4. As per the agreement executed between the Government and the Kerala Self financing Dental College Management Consortium, the Managements have agreed to give concession in the fees collected to the candidates belonging to BPL families as per state norms/students having low annual family income up to a maximum number of 14% of those allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The Managements have agreed to give fee concession to the students belonging to SEBC category numbering up to a maximum of 26% of those allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examination in each institution. The details of concessional fees shall be as follows:
- a) 14% of candidates from among those allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in each institution coming under BPL families as per Kerala State norms irrespective of rank or category need only pay an annual tuition of Rs.23,000/-. If enough number of candidates belonging to BPL category as above are not available, the balance number of candidates will be allowed concessional fees of Rs.23,000/- per annum to be selected from among those allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in each institution from those having lower family income, irrespective of rank or category. However SC/ST category of candidates, who already enjoy fee concession benefits will not be considered for the above purpose.
- b) 26% of candidates who have been allowed SEBC status by the Commissioner for Entrance Examination in each institution shall pay an annual tuition fee of Rs.44,000/-. They will be selected on the basis of the rank. However, if the required number of SEBC candidates is not available among the students allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations in the institution, the remaining number of candidates will be selected from among the general category on the basis of income, irrespective of rank or category as explained in clause (a), with the total number of SEBC students eligible for concessional fee not exceeding 26% as above.
- c) The same principle as explained in clauses (a) and (b) is applicable to the minority institutions also.
- d) All other candidates as explained in clause (a), (b) & SC/ST shall pay an annual tuition fee of ₹ 1,20,000/- The fee benefits will be granted only after the closure of allotments to Private Self financing Dental Colleges. Hence candidates (except SC/ST) allotted to these institutions will have to remit the fee of ₹ 1,20,000/- provisionally at the time of the allotment. The Commissioner for Entrance Examination will refund the balance amount to the candidates who will become eligible for fee benefits after the completion of the allotment process, based on the verification of income certificate to be produced by them.

- e) Annual fee for SC/ST students shall be paid by the Government to the concerned college, at the rate of uniform fees fixed by the Government.
- 5. The annual fees fixed as above shall be inclusive of all amounts collected as in the case of similarly situated students in Government Colleges. However, the management concerned shall be entitled to collect such other statutorily permitted fees including University fees and charges and such other amounts collected from similarly situated students in Government colleges or the Government controlled Dental Colleges, which shall be specifically listed out and published each year, during the entire course of study. The management concerned shall not collect any amount from any student so admitted, other than those specified above.
- 6. 35% of the seats shall be filled up by the management concerned from the merit list prepared on the basis of a common entrance test conducted by Kerala Private Dental College Management Consortium under the supervision of Admission Supervisory Committee complying with the conditions stipulated in the prospectus of the consortium.
- 7. Each student admitted by the managements concerned to the above mentioned 35% seats shall pay annual tuition fees up to ₹ 3,75,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs and Seventy five thousand only), for which signed and sealed receipts shall be given by the management concerned. In addition to the above the management can collect an amount Rs.3,00,000/-(Rupees Three lakhs only) from the students in this category as interest free deposit. It shall be refunded at the end of the course without interest. In addition to the above the managements shall be entitled to collect such other fees payable by the managements to the University, Government, Dental Council of India and transportation charges, examination conducting charges, extra curricular and other establishment charges etc. which shall be listed out and published each year at a uniform rate in all colleges coming under the consortium.
- 8. The managements concerned shall be entitled to fill up the remaining 15% seats by eligible students who are children/ dependants of Non Resident Indians. Such students shall be liable to pay annual tuition fees up to ₹ 4,25,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs and Twenty five thousand Only).
- 10. The management concerned will ensure that no consideration in cash or kind other than those specified above shall be received, accepted or collected in any form whatsoever from any student admitted to the college. It shall be the liability of the Association and educational agency concerned jointly and severally to redress complaints from the students, parents or interested parties on any matter other than those covered by the terms and conditions of this agreement. Where the Second Party fails to redress any complaints referred to, as above or on any matter covered under this agreement, it shall be the duty of the First Party to take such steps as required under law to redress the complaint.

- 11. The Government shall arrange to provide PHC/CHC facilities and ensure supply of cadavers required for the member colleges of the association mentioned above as per the norms fixed by the Government to the member colleges, which have signed this agreement with the Government.
- 12. If a student leaves the college after taking admission after the last date of closing admissions, he/she will be liable to pay the entire fees for full course as liquidated damages.
- 13. The College mentioned above shall be entitled to collect uniform fees approved/ endorsed for BDS course for the College concerned, by the Fee Regulatory Committee in the State, from all (100%) students, excluding those admitted under NRI quota, in the event of this consensual agreement entered into is not approved or the consensual agreement or the fees structure mentioned in clauses 5 and 8 above are declared to be void or not enforceable by the Courts or any authority competent to declare so.
