ORDER

As per the letter read above the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has directed the State /Union Territory Governments to go for the combined counseling for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses in all Medical/Dental colleges including Deemed Universities.

In the circumstances Government of Kerala hereby direct the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations to make allotment/admission to MBBS course under Government/Management/NRI Quota seats in all the Private Self Financing Medical colleges including Private/Deemed Universities in the State as per the following terms and conditions.

1. 50% of the total seats for MBBS course will be allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations from among the candidates who have qualified for admission to MBBS courses in the Kerala Medical Entrance Examination 2016 in accordance with the merit and reservation principles followed by the Government from time to time.
2. Out of the remaining 50% seats, 35% of the total seats will be allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations from the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) Rank List of 2016 based on merit and eligibility conditions. Remaining 15% of the total seats will be allotted from the Non Resident Indian (NRI) category by the Commissioner for Entrance Examination on the basis of NEET Rank List 2016 based on merit and eligibility conditions as per the conditions stipulated in GO(Ms) No. 34/2013/H&FWD dated 05.02.2013 and further orders in this regard.
3. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the list of the students to be admitted in the college by the Management concerned and the Management concerned shall admit the students specified in the list. The students in the list will be given specific instructions as to the date and time of presentation before the college for admission, the amount of fees to be paid, the amount of refundable deposit, if any, to be remitted and the records to be submitted at the time of admission. The Management concerned shall admit the students who have complied with the instruction as required by the CEE.
4. Whereas the colleges having **Minority Status**, 30% seats out of the 50% seats mentioned in para 1 (ie. 15 in every batch of 100) will be filled up by the Government from the KEAM-2016 rank list prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations by the students belonging

to the minority community which established the member college based on their inter-se merit. These seats shall be allotted from among the students belonging to the community to which the educational agency belongs, on the basis of merit. For allotment under these categories, every member college shall inform the community/criteria for eligibility, documents to be submitted, the details of the authority issuing the certificates etc. to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations on or before 27.08.2016. This right is at the option of the educational agency.

In the case of Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Medical College, Karakonam, the minority seats distribution shall as follows.

- (i) Thirteen seats shall be allotted from among the candidates based on inter-se merit from among the members of SIUC Nadar community under South Kerala Diocese of Church of South India.
 - (ii) One seat shall be allotted from among the candidates based on inter-se merit among the members of SC/ST candidates of South Kerala Diocese of Church of South India.
 - (iii) One seat shall be allotted from among the candidates based on inter-se merit among the members of non Nadar SIUC other than the categories mentioned as (i) and (ii) above under South Kerala Diocese of Church of South India.
 - (iv) In the absence of candidates in category (iii) above, the seats shall be allotted from category (ii) above and in the absence of candidates in category (ii) above, the seat shall be allotted from category (i) above.
5. In the case of Self Financing Medical colleges under Kerala Christian Professional College Management Federation, the annual tuition fee payable by all students other than NRI quota students shall be Rs. 4,40,000/- (Rupees four lakh forty thousand only) per annum as fixed in the Government Order GO (Rt) No. 1623/2015/H&FWD dated 30-05-2015. The annual tuition fee payable by NRI quota students shall be Rs. 12,00,000/- (Rupees twelve lakhs only) per annum. The colleges under Kerala Christian Professional College Management Federation will set apart a sum of Rs. 44,00,000/- (Rupees forty four lakhs only) for 100 MBBS students in the academic year 2016-17 to be provided as scholarship in the form of tuition fee waiver to students from BPL families, other financially poor and the marginalized, the criteria for which will be specified by Government. The said money will be kept in a separate fund by the management. However, if the number of candidates admitted in any batch is less than 100 for MBBS, the above said sum will also be proportionately reduced. The scholarship amount can be apportioned among the BPL and the other eligible candidates, in the proportion decided and announced by the Government as per G O (Rt) No. 3498/2012/H&FWD dated 20-10-2012. The beneficiaries of the scheme will be confined to those allotted by the CEE from the Kerala Medical Entrance Rank List-2016. If there is any excess money remaining after covering the students from BPL families and those falling in the category economically poor as defined by the Government, the rest of the amount will be pooled in a scholarship fund for assisting students from BPL and economically poor families in the subsequent years. Managements reserve the right to seek an enquiry by any competent agency of the income claimed by any

student for availing the scholarship to avoid malpractices. In case it is found that any candidate has availed the scholarship by furnishing false information, the amount so claimed could be forfeited from such candidates and admission can be cancelled.

6. In the case of Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur and other Private Self Financing Medical Colleges and Private/Deemed Universities in the State, the tuition fee payable for 50% seats allotted by the CEE from KEAM Rank List, 15% NRI quota seats, the remaining 35% of the total seats to be filled up from the NEET Rank list and the applicable fee concession if any shall be fixed by Government later.
7. The annual fees to be fixed shall be the complete tuition fee. However, the college shall be entitled to collect from every students admitted to the college irrespective of whether they have been allotted under reservation or otherwise, Caution Deposit of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) and other statutorily permitted fees and such other amounts collected from similarly situated students in Government Colleges or Government Controlled Self Financing Colleges which shall be specifically listed out and published each year during the entire course of study. The Management concerned shall not collect any amount from any student so admitted other than those specified above. Signed and sealed receipt shall be given by the Management/College for all the fees collected.
8. In the case of SC/ST candidates, the annual fees shall be paid by the Government from the funds provided to the SC/ST Development department.
9. Where, the students has at the time of admission remitted the total fees, but thereafter is found eligible for Fee Concession/Scholarship, the management is liable to return the excess fee realized from the students within one week of the intimation of such concession by the CEE and the management shall be liable to pay interest to the student at 18% per annum for any delay over the stipulated period of one week. Furthermore, where the student has been admitted to a college after the first allotment but has subsequently been allotted to another college on the basis of the second allotment, the Management is liable to return the entire fee remitted by the student, if any, by way of Demand Draft after proper acknowledgment, within three days of the second allotment to the student, failing which the Management shall be liable to pay interest to the student at 18% per annum for any delay over this stipulated period.
10. There will be provisions to protect the minority rights of institutions which possess minority status, as in the last year. Such institutions shall inform the CEE, the criteria/norms for such claims, if any, in the 35% seats to be filled up by the CEE from the NEET rank list 2016, which are in conformity with the norms approved by the Admission Supervisory Committee or the orders of the Hon'ble High Court or the Hon'ble Supreme Court, on or before **27.08.2016** If, for any reason, such Minority Institution fails to furnish the norms for allotment/ admission of minority candidates within the stipulated time, the candidates from such minority community will be allotted to the institution on the basis of the norms approved by the Admission Supervisory Committee for last year admissions.
11. The nativity conditions as stipulated in Clause 6.1 of the Prospectus for KEAM 2016 shall be applicable for admission to MBBS course in all the seats. Accordingly, only Keralite and Non-

Keralite I(NK I) category students are eligible for admission to MBBS course in Self Financing Medical Colleges and Private/Deemed Universities.

12. The Educational Agency/Management shall not accept any consideration in cash or kind, other than those specified above in any form whatsoever from any student admitted by the Educational Agency. It shall be the liability of the Educational Agency to redress complaints from the students, parents or interested parties on any matter other than those covered under this order. Where the Educational Agency fails to redress any complaints referred to as above or any matter covered under this order, it shall be the duty of the Government to take such steps as required to redress the complaint, as permitted by the Law.
13. The Government shall arrange to provide PHC/CHC/Autopsy perceiving facilities at Government Medical Colleges and ensure supply of cadavers required for the college as per the norms fixed by the Government.
14. The Educational Agency will be free to execute appropriate Service bond from the students admitted under Government Quota, except SC/ST students, for a period not exceeding one year, on similar terms as the Bond executed by the students admitted in Government Medical Colleges.
