In response to your communication referred as 1st paper above, the following clarification is issued

1. As per the Rules and the Court order, the sponsor should be person employed in abroad. Therefore, if the job is not specified in the passport/visa/green card/OCI, the sponsor is liable to obtain employment certificate attested by the Embassy/Consulate/ Competent authorities and should be produced.

2. If the validity of visa has been expired, the copy of the document/online acknowledgement seeking the extension of visa should be produced.
3. Paragraph 2 of the order referred as 3rd paper above, is applicable for the clarification sought in your email item number 3.
4. If the candidate produce entry permit wherein the job, validity and other details are specified, it can be accepted.
5. In the case of candidates, who belong to the 2nd and 3rd clause mentioned above, shall execute an affidavit to the effect that they will produce the documents before the approval of admission by the ASC and on failure in producing the document as stated above, the admission of the candidate is liable to be rejected and they shall be bound to pay the amount towards liquidated damages as specified in the KEAM Prospectus.

The above clarification/relaxation is issued only for this academic year considering the present pandemic situation.

Medical & Medical Allied Courses NRI admission 2020-21- Modification of earlier Directives issued by the ASC in complying the Hon'ble High Court Order- Directives issued on 22.01.2020

DIRECTIVES

1. The Admission Supervisory Committee, in short the ASC, have issued directives for admitting candidates under NRI quota in consideration of the various judgments of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala, including the judgment in W.P (C) No. 14708 of 2012 (K), Dr. Gowriraj Vs State of Kerala and 10 others and as per G.O. (MS)No. 243/14/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014.

2. However, during the time of approval of admissions in respect of the Medical

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and Allied Courses have found certain irregularities and the admissions of certain candidates have been withheld for curing the defects. But certain Medical and Medical Allied Courses have approached the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala against the withheld order of the ASC. The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala has issued certain directions for sponsoring the NRI candidates.

3. The ASC held a meeting on 07.01.2020 and discussed about the judgments issued by the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala. After elaborate discussion and deliberation have decided to issue directives as per the directions contained in the various Hon'ble High Court Judgment and G.O (Ms) No. 243/14/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014. Accordingly, the following directives are issued clarifying the directives already issued by the ASC.
 - a. A candidate, who apply for the NRI seat should submit the Passport copy and Visa/Green Card/OCI Documents of their respective sponsors. The Job of the sponsor should be mentioned in any of the above documents.
 - b. The Visa of the sponsor should be valid till the closing date of admission in respect of the Medical and Allied Courses.
 - c. In case, the employment of the sponsor is not mentioned in the above documents, the candidate has to produce the employment certificate of the sponsor attested by the Embassy/ Consulate authorities.
 - d. The certificates clearly establishing the relationship of the sponsor with the candidate shall be obtained from the revenue authorities, as per the G.O (Ms) No. 243/14/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014.
 - e. However, the revelation ship between the candidate and his/her

father/mother, which are recorded in the educational certificates, maintained in the usual course of transactions by the competent authorities, shall be accepted.

- e. The Candidate shall produce the sworn affidavit from the Sponsor in a stamp paper worth Rs. 200/-. The same shall also be notarised by the Notary Public, disclosing that the student is dependent of the sponsor and the all expenses i.e. tuition fee and special fee, of the candidate for the entire course period will be borne by the Sponsor.

✓ All the certificates/documents required to establish NRI Status/ Non Creamy Layer /Minority etc. shall be produced at the time of submission of application itself. The certificate produced later shall not be entertained under any circumstances.

4. Email this directives to the Principal Secretary, H&FWD, the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, the Registrar, KUHS and the Principals of the Self Financing Medical and Medical Allied Courses for strict compliance.

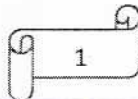

ORDER

The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, in short the CEE, through communication dated 29.04.2020 has informed the Admission Supervisory Committee, hereinafter referred as the Committee, that several NRI candidates who seek admission for MD/MS/ MDS and KEAM have requested for relaxation in submitting NRI documents due to the present pandemic situation. In one case, the Committee already issued a direction to the CEE to relax in submitting certain documents due to the present situation. Therefore, certain other complaints are being received in the CEE office, it has requested to issue a Common Order.

2. In the meanwhile, the Directorate General of Health Services, Government of India has issued a notice/ advisory dated 13.04.2020, wherein it is stated that

“In view of the difficult situation/lockdown COVID-19 outbreak, Colleges are advised to sympathetically deal with the issues faced by the Candidates of NEET PG 2020.

If there is deficiency of one or two non-essential documents or payment of complete fees, the college may take an Undertaking from the Candidates that he/she will be depositing the remaining fee or documents when the Candidate (s) will be physically reporting at the College.”

3. In the above fact situation, the Committee found it appropriate to relax certain documents, which they are unable to produce in the pandemic situation, therefore, the Principal of the Medical/Dental Colleges are hereby strictly directed to comply notice/ advisory issued by the Directorate General of Health Services, Government of India, while taking admission.
4. Email this order to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations and the Principals of the Self Financing Medical/Dental Colleges in Kerala
